### **Roman Baths**

Definitely worth seeing because of 2000-year-old architecture (they are the best-preserved baths in Northern Europe).

Main attractions: *temple of Sulis Minerva*, *Goddess of the Thermal Spring*; *bath house*. Maybe a bit expensive but you can spend your whole day at the baths!

Admission for students £8.75 but it is possible to buy a "*Saver Ticket*" (£13.50) which is valid for both *Roman Baths* and *Fashion Museum*.
